TIMOTHY J. KRUEGER

Timothy J. Krueger studied musicology at the Wheaton Conservatory of Music, the University of Colorado, Boulder, the Universität Hamburg, Germany, and the University of London's Royal Holloway College, where his doctoral dissertation was on the sacred music of Charles Villiers Stanford. He has studied conducting with Dr. Paul Wiens, and privately with Dennis Keene of the Voices of Ascension. He has sung professionally with the Santa Fe Opera, the Santa Fe Desert Chorale, Chicago A Cappella, the Vox Early Music Ensemble, the Ars Nova Singers, as well as several Episcopal cathedral choirs. In addition to being the founding Artistic Director of St. Martin's Chamber Choir, Krueger has served as Chorus Director for the Boulder Bach Festival, the Colorado Music Festival, and the Boulder Philharmonic. He is an Affiliate Faculty member in the Music Department of Metropolitan State University of Denver. He is Choirmaster of St. Andrew's Episcopal Church, overseeing one of Denver's finest classical church music programs.



SARA GARZA

Sara Garza (she/her) is a passionate conductor, educator, and vocalist who believes firmly in the necessity of equitable music education for all. Hailing from Lakewood, Colorado, Sara is currently pursuing her Master of Music degree in Choral Conducting at the University of Denver, where she is a Graduate Teaching Assistant for Voces Aureas and the Lamont Chorale. She received her Bachelor of Music Education degree from Metropolitan State University of Denver, where she studied voice with Gene Roberts and conducting with MB Krueger.

Prior to her graduate studies, Sara served as both the Vocal Music Director and the Spring Musical Director at Evergreen High School. She currently holds a position on the Colorado ACDA board, where she enjoys coordinating events and connecting with colleagues. Sara has performed with Elus Vocal Ensemble and the Colorado Symphony Chorus, as well as several collegiate ensembles and church choirs – she even enjoyed an undergraduate singer internship with St. Martin's Chamber Choir in 2018!

A Note from the Founder/Artistic Director

Not only is the *Magnificat* the text most frequently set to music by classical composers, I believe it has inspired some of the best music from these composers. This canticle, recorded in the Gospel of Luke as the Virgin Mary's song of praise upon hearing that she is to bear the Son of God, seems to stir the creativity of composers, and results in works of particular genius.

Last year we presented a concert similar to this one, and it elicited an enthusiastic response. I have repeated five works from last year (some were my favorites, others garnered particular praise from audience members), but the remainder are new. Interspersed with the survey of Magnificats from across the centuries are some works based on familiar Advent tunes – Conditor alme siderum, Wachet auf, Llangloffan, and Veni Emmanuel. Advent is not as familiar in our culture as it once was, and therefore has ceased to be much of a draw for audiences in and of itself; but for many people who still hold to the tradition of Advent as a season of preparation for the joys of Christmas, it is one of the most beloved times of the year. This concert is for them (or perhaps I should say "us").

So, as this year's Holiday Season gets under way, I wish you, on behalf of the singers, staff, and board of St. Martin's Chamber Choir, a most merry and joyous festival.

Still an educator, Matthew maintains a private lesson studio of voice, piano, and brass students. In addition, Matthew substitute teaches in music classroom throughout Cherry Creek School District and serves as the Assistant Director of Bethany Lutheran Church's Chancel Choir. This is Matthew's first season with Saint Martin's Chamber Choir and he couldn't be more excited to meet more choral musicians and explore new traditions of music with the choir.



KRISTIN GORNSTEIN

Praised as "a fine actress with a deep, spacious sound" [Parterre], American mezzo-soprano Kristin Gornstein brings her "rich-voiced mezzo-soprano" and "lines of an uncannily silky legato" [New York Times] to her work, ranging from the traditional to the edgy

and imaginative. She was lauded for her recent portrayal of Piramo in Johan Hasse's baroque gem *Piramo* e *Tisbe* with The Little Opera Theatre of New York, with

Opera News calling her performance, "...masterful. She sang the difficult role with a truly flawless lyric mezzo". In 2019 she debuted the role of Julie in Pulitzer Prizenominated composer Alex Weiser's opera *State of the Jews*. The 2020-2021 season included a return to the Little Opera Theatre of New York for a digital release of scenes from Mozart's *Il Re Pastore*. The 2021-22 season brings performances with the Brooklyn Art Song Society, The Boulder Bach Festival, and a performance of Johan deMeij's 5th Symphony, *Return to Middle Earth*, with the Buffalo Niagara Concert Band.

In previous seasons she portrayed Ramiro in Mozart's La finta giardiniera in a co-production by On Site Opera and Atlanta Opera, a role she reprised in 2018 at the Caramoor Summer Festival. She performed in the ensemble of Michael Gordon and Deborah Artman's groundbreaking opera Acquanetta, both in the 2018 world premiere at the Prototype Festival and at Bard Summerscape in 2019. Kristin made her Carnegie Hall debut in the Spring of 2018, winning third place in the Lyndon Woodside Oratorio Competition. She has toured with Mark Morris Dance Company's acclaimed production of Purcell's Dido and Aeneas as an ensemble member, and appeared at Lincoln Center with the New York Philharmonic for Honegger's Jean D'Arc au Bûcher.



MB KRUEGER

MB Krueger is the Director of Choral Activities at Metropolitan State University of Denver, where she directs the Chorale, University Treble Choir, and University Basso Choir and teaches all levels of undergraduate conducting. She served for ten years on

the board of the Colorado Chapter of American Choral Directors Association. She regularly presents sessions at the annual CoACDA Summer Workshop and the annual Colorado Music Educators Association convention. MB grew up in Michigan's Upper Peninsula, and earned her degrees in music education at Michigan State University and Miami University (Ohio). She has sung with St. Martin's Chamber Choir and St. Andrew's Episcopal Church Choir since 1997, and has also sung professionally with the Santa Fe Desert Chorale, the Santa Fe Opera, Ars Nova Singers, Diverse Passions Early Music Ensemble, and the Baroque Chamber Orchestra of Colorado.



MACKENZIE LAUN

Mackenzie Laun, Soprano, is a Denver native. She holds her Bachelor of Music Education from the University of Northern Colorado, and is currently pursuing her Masters of Music Education with an emphasis in con-

ducting from Colorado State University. She spent nine years as a public high school choir teacher in Jeffco, but now enjoys the life of a stay-at-home mom and freelance singer. Mackenzie sings professionally all over Denver with groups like St. Martin's Chamber Choir, Anima Chamber Ensemble, and Elus Vocal Ensemble. Some of her favorite past engagements

the Badger State including the Madison Chamber Choir, Madison Choral Project and Madison Opera. In 2018, Matthew relocated to Denver where he now enjoys singing with St. Martin's Chamber Choir and working in IT Project Management. He is also a staff singer at St. Andrew's Episcopal Church.



HANNAH McGINTY

A recent transplant to Boulder, Hannah McGinty has quickly found a musical home, singing as a staff singer at St. Andrew's Denver, as a choral prowith Ars Nova Boulder, and with Elus Ensemble. She also serves as principal soloist and chorusmaster for Austin

Baroque Orchestra & Choir, and is a member of the Texas Early Music Project, Ars Longa Ensemble, and Austin Cantorum. She previously directed and sung in the Burgundian Consort and the University of Chicago Camerata, chamber choirs dedicated to wellresearched performances of Renaissance choral music. Hannah received her B.A. in Musicology with Honors at the University of Chicago, her Masters of Music in Voice, specializing in Historical Performance, and her Master of Arts in Musicology at the Jacobs School of Music, Indiana University. She has attended numerous early music summer programs around the world, notably singing as Calisto in scenes from La Calisto at the Amherst Early Music Festival, and in two fullyhistorically-staged productions with La Petite Bande under the baton of Sigiswald Kuijken, as Costanza in Haydn's opera L'isola disabitata, and as Susanna in Le nozze di Figaro. In addition to her singing, Hannah also plays piano, violin, and harpsichord, and enjoys hiking, knitting, yoga, cooking, and reading fiction from all over the world.



ANN MARIE MORGAN

Praised by the Baltimore Sun for her "beguiling musicality," Ann Marie Morgan is a frequent guest artist on viola da gamba, and has performed in the Bach St. John and St. Matthew Passions with the Cleveland, Philadelphia and Minnesota

Orchestras. She has been featured at Bach Festivals including those in Oregon, Bethlehem, and Boulder, as well as in performances internationally in Germany, the Czech Republic, Turkey, Central America and Canada. Ms Morgan has served on the Early Music faculties of the Peabody Institute of the Johns Hopkins University and at the Interlochen Center for the Arts. shop a cappella style.





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
