TIMOTHY J. KRUEGER

Timothy J. Krueger studied musicology at the Wheaton Conservatory of Music, the University of Colorado, Boulder, the Universität Hamburg, Germany, and the University of London's Royal Holloway College, where his doctoral dissertation was on the sacred music of Charles Villiers Stanford. He has studied conducting with Dr. Paul Wiens, and privately with Dennis Keene of the Voices of Ascension. He has sung professionally with the Santa Fe Opera, the Santa Fe Desert Chorale, Chicago A Cappella, the Vox Early Music Ensemble, the Ars Nova Singers, as well as several Episcopal cathedral choirs. In addition to being the founding Artistic Director of St. Martin's Chamber Choir, Krueger has served as Chorus Director for the Boulder Bach Festival, the Colorado Music Festival,

and the Boulder Philharmonic. He is an Affiliate Faculty member in the Music Department of Metropolitan State University of Denver. He is Choirmaster of St. Andrew's Episcopal Church, overseeing one of Denver's finest classical church music programs.

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ANTHONY WIRTZ

Anthony is currently a dual-master's student at The Lamont School of Music at The University of Denver studying both vocal performance and conducting. His choral music experience is extensive at almost 30 years - starting all the way back to grade school in Belmond, Iowa. His interest in vocal arts started when he was very young as he comes from a musical family who would often gather around the piano to sing and harmonize in four-parts. He has been a member of SPEBSQSA (the Barbershop Harmony Society) as well as the Norsemen and Nordic choirs at Luther College, is active in the Lamont Opera program and the Opera Colorado chorus, sings with The Lamont Chorale and Voces Fortes, and has participated in countless choral recitals and honors choral programs interspersed

throughout his career. He currently sings with Denver's St. John's Cathedral with the Vicars Choir. Along with all his choral experience, he is also an active multiinstrumentalist, composer, and music history/theory enthusiast. SIMON JACOBS

Simon Jacobs enjoys a multi-faceted musical career as an organist, conductor, pianist and singer throughout the United States and Europe. He was born in Truro, Cornwall, UK to a musical family, and received his early musical training as a full-time boy chorister. He went on to receive degrees in music and choral conducting from Cambridge University and Yale University, and then spent consecutive years as Organ Scholar at Salisbury Cathedral and Westminster Abbey. Simon has given organ concerts, conducted choirs and collaborated with many well-known musicians at prestigious churches, cathedrals and concert halls around the world, and is equally at home working in the classical, jazz, and musical theatre fields.

In addition to his performing work, Simon is an on-air radio host at Colorado Springs' local classical and jazz music stations, KCME 88.7 and Jazz 93.5, where he is delighted to share his musical passions and expertise with the wider community. At KCME, he presents a number of special programs, such as The King of Instruments, Choral Splendour and The Bach Legacy. He also enjoys working as a music director and keyboardist with the professional Fine Arts Center Theatre Company in Colorado Springs. Simon is Director of Music at the historic Manitou Community Church, and collaborates regularly with some of the area's top ensembles, such as The Chamber Orchestra of the Springs, the Colorado Vocal Arts Ensemble, and the Colorado Springs Chorale.




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


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
